Introduction

Natural resources such as water, green areas, and landscape, and citizen participation are key elements in the future of cities. Seville’s features as a southern riverside city and nature reintegration are the baseline for the whole set of activities that make up the Council of Europe Meeting of Workshops for the Implementation of the Landscape Convention and the International Congress “Water, landscape and citizenship in the face of Global Change” (hereinafter TEyCI, from its acronym in Spanish). It is the framework for the actions commemorating the 25th anniversary of the Mediterranean Landscape Charter (approved in Seville in April 1992, and used by the Council of Europe as a reference for drafting a similar agreement covering the entire continent.

The city of Seville will bring together during three days national and international experts, researchers and academics working in cities, water management, and landscape design and construction, as well as organizations and associations that use and have an interest in water and green areas on a daily basis.

The TEyCI is structured into three work scenarios: European Workshops, International Congress and Citizens Participation Activities. All three address topics that fall within the frame of the main argument of the Meeting “Water, landscape and citizenship in the face of Global Change”.

The **European Workshops** follow a programme defined by the Council of Europe and they comprise four Workshops addressing on different themes, which are specified below in the “Programme” section.

The **International Congress** is a complementary event to the European Workshops and its aim is to focus the themes of the four workshops on the urban and metropolitan scale. Therefore, the different work schemes in the Congress (see the “Programme” section) will address cases of cities and metropolitan areas that stand out for their interest and are benchmarks in compared international experiences. Following this approach the Congress plays the role of connecting the global approach of the Workshops and the citizen participation activities involving the city of Seville and its metropolitan area.

Thus, the **Citizen Participation Activities** to be held in parallel with the TEyCI and in the city of Seville and the municipalities of its metropolitan area between the 15th January and the 15th April 2019, will disseminate the experiences obtained from the different topics addressed in the TEyCI. In this way, the capital of Andalusia will be the scenario to implement the general arguments of the European Workshops, and the conclusions at urban and metropolitan scale from the communications and other work carried out at the International Congress will be shared with the citizens. These activities are framed into three main sections or themes: Water, Landscape and Heritage; Green and Blue Systems of Seville and its Metropolitan Area; Citizen Challenges in the face of Global Change.

Programme

The scientific programme of the TEyCI will take place on the 14th, 15th and 16th March 2019.

Four different workshops addressing different topics are planned for the European Workshops. They will include presentations, discussion sessions and a poster exhibition area. A welcome event will be held at the headquarters of EMASESA.

Workshop I: “Water in landscapes and water landscapes in Spain”

It will be devoted mainly to present Spanish cases. The topics addressed are landscapes generated or explained by water, enjoying a significant presence of water both in physical and material terms and in symbolic terms; and changes and projects planned or already carried out in these landscapes.

Workshop II. “Water landscapes: international experiences”

It will address the different European regulatory planning instruments and protects with an impact on water landscapes (projects involving water management, irrigation, green urban systems, historical gardens, etc.).

Three types of works will be admitted: communications and/or posters and videos. Authors shall present a communication in order to have the option to adapt them to poster or video format.

5. Selection of Works

The scientific committee will select the communications to be included in the International Congress Proceedings. All communications will be recorded by the rapporteurs present in the different discussion sessions of each of the Workshops.

Presentation of citizen communications and participation

Objectives of the communications. Participants

In order to encourage technical and citizen participation we are launching a call to society to contribute to sustainable urban development and environmental education in the face of global change, and especially to the study of landscape at urban and metropolitan scale, by means of participatory communications of individual citizens and groups.

Contents of the communications. Characteristics and objectives

In addition to its contribution to landscape culture and development as an element in spatial planning and as cultural, economic and social good, the International Congress focuses on studying cities with water as a key element, making emphasis on social participation.

The content of the Communications for the International Congress shall focus on studies, analysis and proposals of landscapes in any European city where water has played an important role in its genesis or still plays it in present time.

The TEyCI will display experiences of international, national, regional and local policies connected to the presence of water in landscapes, and to the protection and management of water resources with the following objectives:

- Recognising landscapes in law as an essential component of people’s surroundings, an expression of the diversity of their shared cultural and natural heritage, and a foundation of their identity.
- Establishing and implementing landscape policies aimed at landscape protection, management and planning through the adoption of the specific measures (set out in the Convention).
- Establishing procedures for the participation of the general public, local and regional authorities, and other stakeholders with an interest in the definition and implementation of the landscape policies.
- Integrating landscape into local, regional, national and international spatial and urban planning policies: cultural, environmental, agricultural, social and economic policies, as well as into any other policies with possible direct or indirect impact on landscape, and in this case, with a specific focus on policies for the management of water resources and the presence of water in the landscape.

The conclusions of the Meeting will be presented at the Meeting of the Steering Committee for Culture, Heritage and Landscape (CDCPP), and at the next Council of Europe Conference on the implementation of the European Landscape Convention.

Communications

Languages: English, French and/or Spanish

Authors interested in presenting a communication shall submit a 150-word summary (introduction, objectives and conclusions). At least four key terms in Spanish and English must be included.

Communications can include not more than three images (one file per image) in JPG format with a 300 pp resolution and A4 size for their further publication; images may include maps, charts, photos and infographics to illustrate the communication.

Submitted communication shall be drafted according to the template you [can download by clicking here](#).

Full texts shall be sufficiently detailed as to allow the Scientific Committee to judge the merits of the work submitted, including a description of the topic discussed, theoretical approach, methods, data and expected results.

Posters

Graphic composition required for posters is a 70 x 100 cm panel with a 300 pp resolution (JPG or PDF file) arranged vertically. The top section of the poster must show the figurative mark or logo of the TEyCI (download here).

If the poster is selected, it must be presented printed on a 1-cm thick rigid foam board-type support. It must be delivered to the technical secretariat at the beginning of the TEyCI at the time of collection of accreditations.
